## Hitting the mark

KCLMS continues to score high in competitions. We had another best-ever set of results in the UK Maths Trust's British Mathematical Olympiad Round 2. Students earned a whopping 6 Distinctions and 4 Merits (last year it was 4 and 3 ). Bravo to Year 13 Ryan B who was again our top performer and Adem for Year 12. With the Senior Physics Challenge for Year 12 and Round 2 of the British Physics Olympiad (BPhO) and also the British Astronomy and Astrophysics Olympiad (BAAO) for Year 13, it has been a busy term of problem-solving. Congratulations to Yosif and Joan Pau for achieving Gold in the BPhO Round 2 and to Sofia H for achieving our highest Silver in the BAAO Round 2. Sofia has been selected to train in the Easter Astronomy Camp at the University of Oxford, following in the footsteps of alum Charlotte Stevenson. The camp comprises five days of lectures, tutorials and practical sessions as the team for the International Olympiad is selected.

Nine students took part in the 4-week programme, WeSpeak. Designed to boost the confidence and skills of Year 12 students, this online public speaking training course is supported by industry-experts and mentors from organisations such as Google and Just Eat. Each week participants deliver a short talk and finish the programme by delivering a speech to a small audience.

We were fortunate to have a range of fantastic speakers. Year 13s had a CV writing and interview skills session with recruitment expert Milly Parrott from Man Group. Yash Panjabi from Man Group spoke about his career in financial services. Thanks to Maria Asemah from the same company who discussed internships. We also had internship talks from ZOE, a health science company, and Garrison, a cyber security firm. KCLMS alumni Khalid Ali and Marcus Ikpase, who now work for ZOE and Garrison respectively, spoke to students about their career journeys.

KCLMS and Surrey Maths School have been delighted to offer free, online CPD sessions for teachers of Physics $A$ level.
