## Charity bake-off

Students organised a bake-off to raise funds for victims affected by the earthquakes in Turkey and Syria. They collected hundreds of pounds for the Disasters Emergency Committee. Our thoughts continue to be with the Turkish and Syrian people.

#### Outstanding wins

We continue to excel in competitions. In Physics, 6 students were invited to Round 2 of the prestigious British Physics Olympiad. Ten students participated in the British Astronomy & Astrophysics Olympiad. Notable mentions go to Charlotte S and Katie S who are attending the Oxford Training Campover Easter as a result of their stellar performances. Bravo to Y12 Fred B, who secured a Bronze Award in the BAAO, alongside multiple Y13s.

The British Mathematical Olympiad Round 2, a 3.5-hour Challenge, saw us earn jawdropping results: 4 Distinctions and 3 Merits. Thomas K, who received a Distinction, secured a perfect 40/40 score. He also represented the UK in the Romanian Master of Mathematics competition, earning a Bronze medal. Ema K is part of the UK team for the European Girls' Mathematical Olympiad in April. Arya G, Ryan B, Ema K all received Distinctions. Nguyen N, Aarnav W, Lizzie R all had Merits. Well done all.
